Mt 22:14 "For many are called, but few are **chosen**."

Mt 24:22 "And unless those days had been cut short, no life would have been saved; but for the sake of the **elect** those days shall be cut short.

Mt 24:24 "For false Christs and false prophets will arise and will show great signs and wonders, so as to mislead, if possible, even the **elect**.

Mt 24:31 "And He will send forth His angels with a great trumpet and they will gather together His **elect** from the four winds, from one end of the sky to the other.

Mr 13:20 "And unless the Lord had shortened those days, no life would have been saved; but for the sake of the **elect** whom He chose, He shortened the days.

Ac 4:28 to do whatever Thy hand and Thy purpose **predestined** to occur.
